What does water mean to you? Through Their Eyes: Photographs from the Second Powell Expedition is an exhibition featuring the work of A.D. Shaw and Randy Fullbright. The artists reconstructed images captured by John Wesley Powell's Second Expedition and paired them with diary entries from members of Powell's crew describing the breath-taking scenery along the Green River.
