- **Water|Ways** is a traveling Smithsonian exhibition that dives into water – an essential component of life on our planet, environmentally, culturally, and historically. What does water mean to you? Think about your water/ways. At Fremont Indian State Park Museum (9:00am-5:00pm).
- **Carved Rock: How Water Shaped Land & Life in Clear Creek Canyon** explores how the water of Clear Creek carved a canyon passageway through daunting mountains and served as a source of life and symbol of sustenance to people using the canyon for the last 10,000 years. At the Museum.
- **Drained: Using Water from the Sevier River** shows how irrigation projects started in the 1860s have directed nearly all the Sevier River's water to agriculture and industries and asks whether it's time to re-evaluate this water usage.
